Nevertheless, if you have a fairly broad reading scope on this subject you'll be able to pick out the bits that don't necessarily fit with the broad assumptions. For instance, I'm fairly certain Beebe has never flown a kestrel, or at least a good one. I've heard tell of people taking a hundred starlings a day with a kestrel, yet Beebe dismisses them as a hunting bird and calls them little better than a pet raptor for a young child. What all the same, this book is full of good information if you take it with a grain of salt, and great information if you're looking for a broad overview of falconry in general. It is a wonderful starting point that will likely help you decide whether or not this is a sport you'd like to pursue. The bibliography in the back is extensive, and NAFA itself has many of those books on their own recommended reading lists. Beebe is respected for a reason, and this book rather plainly shows why.
